Dedicated To The Memory of Mr. Rolland Essman

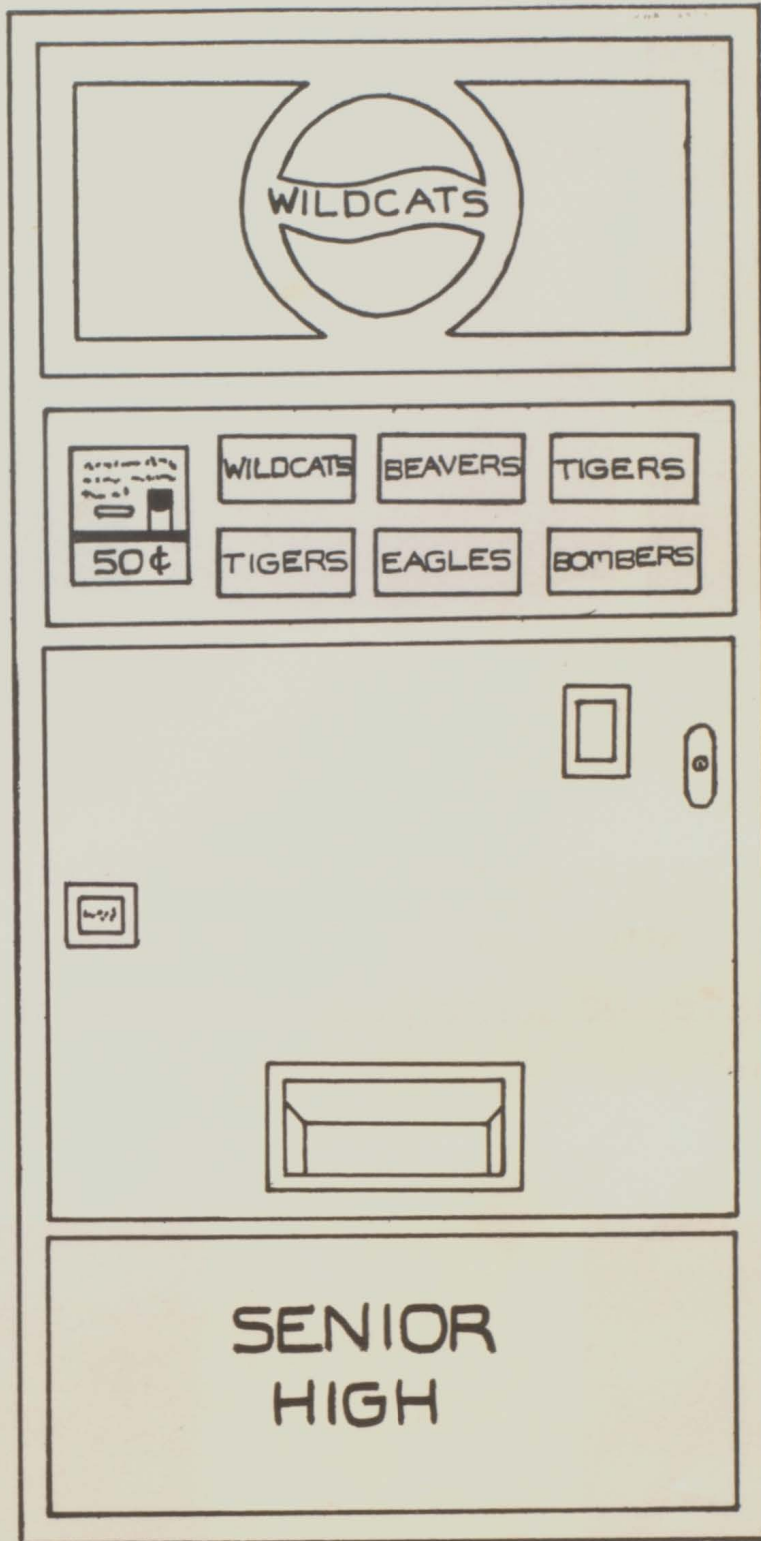


This year the 1986-87 annual staff would like to take this opportunity to dedicate the annual to the memory of Mr. Rolland Essman. Mr. Essman was the vocational agriculture teacher in the North Loup-Scotia school system for 35 years, retiring from his position in May 1986.

Mr. Essman was involved in many activities, but one of the things he really took pride in was land judging. While in teaching, he took numerous teams to the International Land Judging Contest in Oklahoma City. In 1977, the team consisted of David Sims, Gerald Vogeler, Gerald Holt, and Gerald Williams, they came back with 1st place medals. In 1974 he received State Teacher of the Year. He also received the Award of Excellence from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Teachers College Alumni Association. In 1979 he was awarded the American Farmer Degree in Kansas City. In 1986 he received the National DAR Conservation Award, the Distinguished teaching award from the University of Nebraska-Omaha.

Mr. Essman was a firm supporter of and participator in NLS school activities. His dedicated service to our school, its students, and the educational system was appreciated more than we could ever show. We will miss you Mr. Essman, but we will never forget what you have given to us.





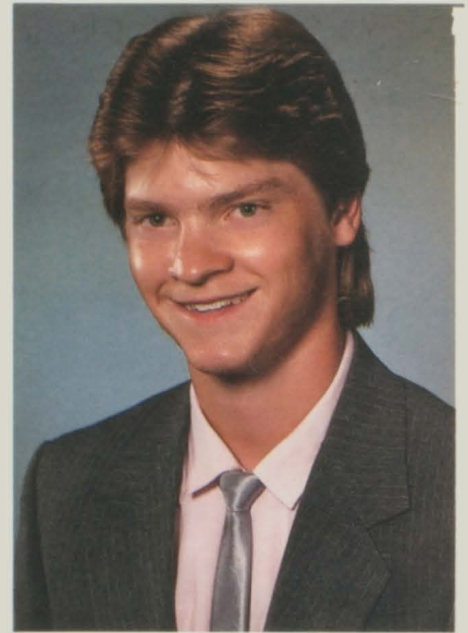

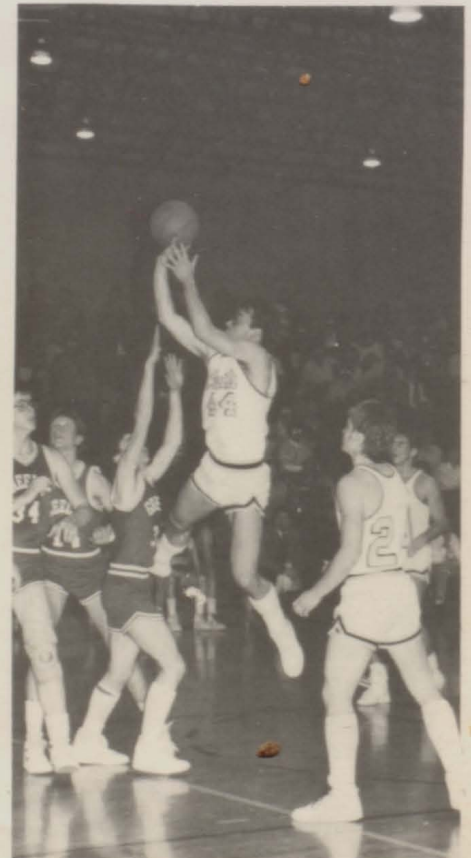

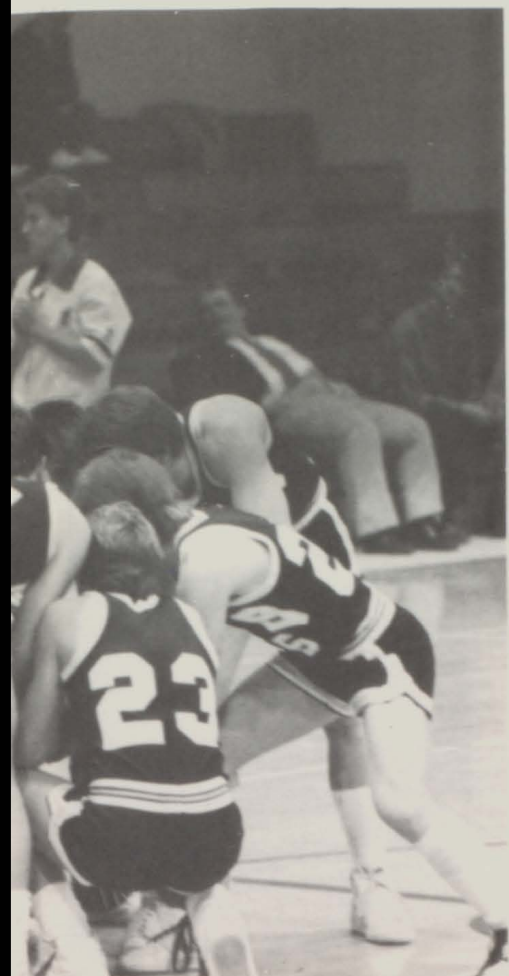

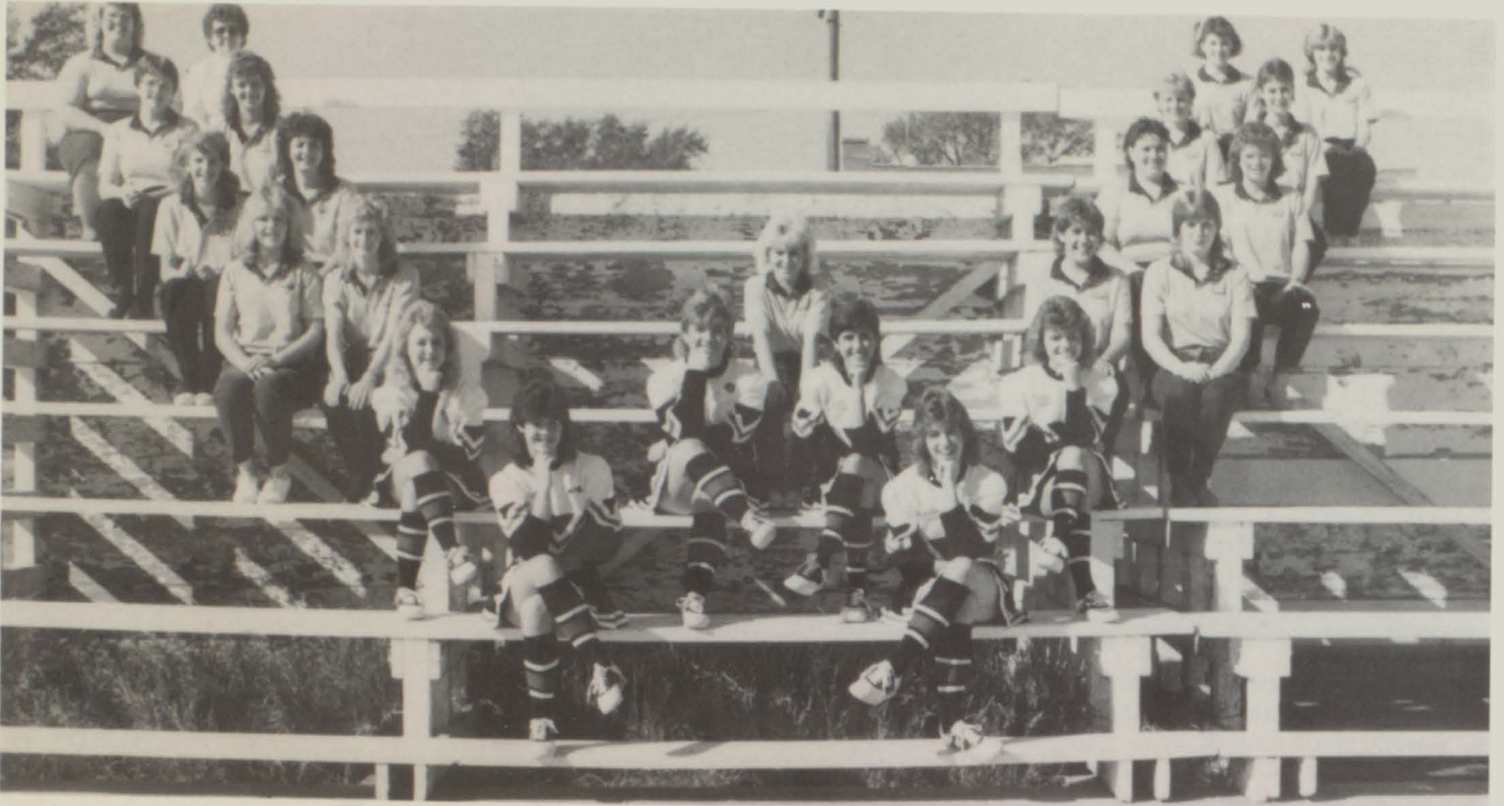
